REPORT FROM YOUR TREASURER

June 4, 2009

Give Thanks to the Lord for HE is good!! And many, many thanks to the "angels" HE used to accomplish HIS work. Thanks to all of those who paid their team fees, their candidate fees and contributed for the "Sheet" Palanca (food, Kleenex, etc), but a very special thanks to those who went beyond the necessary by paying extra for someone who was finding it difficult to pay their fee.

Another special thanks is due to those who have contributed toward the \$5,000 matching grant during the last six and a half months. You gave as the Lord provided and directed and a total of \$5,050.13 was raised. We will be receiving the remaining \$4,500 of the grant money in the near future. This money will be used to set aside the St. Stephen's Fund into a Certificate of Deposit in the amount of \$5,069.53. By doing this we will be in compliance with IRS requirements as a not-for-profit charitable organization.

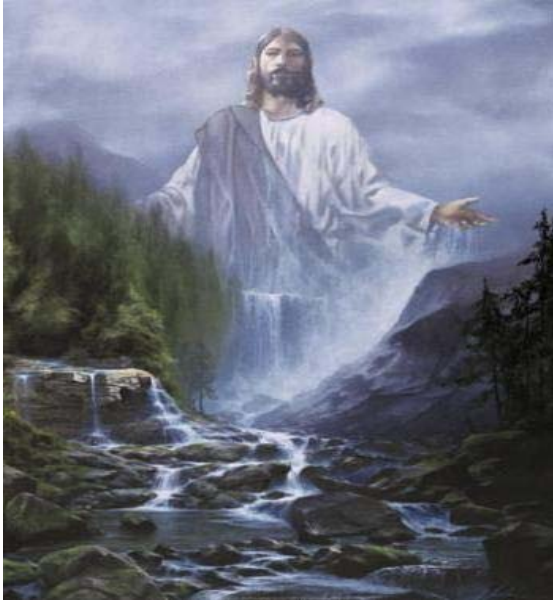

Directions

Of the Global Positioning Systems in our youngest daughter's cars, one has a female voice and our grandchildren have named the car Pearl. One has a male voice and our grandchildren have named that car Matthew. Seems reasonable enough Our oldest daughter also has a GPS, and when I rode with her, the Australian GPS unit instructed us how to get from Durham to her aunt's house in Fuquay, North Carolina. The voice, guiding us through rural N.C. in its Australian accent was funny to listen to. But "he" got us right there! "He" would tell our daughter that she would be making a left (or right) turn so many miles or quarter miles down the road. Then "he" would tell her to turn left or right then and there. If we missed the turn, "he" would tell her to turn around, or "he" would give her a new set of directions.

That started me thinking. We think of the Bible as the "Manufacturer's Handbook," by which we can find guidance for our life questions. More often than not, our Manufacturer gives us directions one step at a time. If we follow, then he gives us another instruction, then another. He can also give us long-term instructions, as He did when guiding me to go into the Presbyterian ministry, guiding me to a church in rural N.C., guiding Martha and me to find each other, when to leave that church to go on to Korea in 1965, then in guiding us when to leave Korea and return to the United States in 1985. Friends asked me when we were leaving Korea where we were going. I said I did not know, but guessed that the church we would be going to did not know that they would be needing me yet.

We discovered more about that unfolding pattern of guidance when we were visiting in Daytona Beach, and lo and behold there was a man and his wife who had visited us in Korea, who was now a presbytery executive in Florida. He asked if I was looking for a church to serve. I said that I was indeed! So he told me about the First Presbyterian Church of Safety Harbor, Florida. I asked, "Where's Safety Harbor?" He told me some of the church's history. One of the things he said that really caught my attention, was that this was a church where the people loved the Lord and loved the church! Aha! Suddenly everything got a lot clearer!

That began a process that ended a few short months later when we moved to Safety Harbor, all the "i's" dotted and the "t's" crossed.

And that process ended and another started when we, knowing that I would be retiring from that church which we loved, asked for guidance as to when we should leave. The Lord showed me once again, as He always has, by his timing, pointing out the state of my stamina and the state of the church. So, following that guidance, I told the congregation in the summer of 1998 that I would be retiring the first week in 1999. In that December I suffered a "small stroke." That underlined that decision that now was the time to retire. No one questioned it after that!

And so it has been all my life – following the Holy Spirit's broad stroke guidance and daily guidance both. He knows just how to guide us. He knows what lies ahead far better than we know.

And that is one of the reasons I can give when someone asks me why I love the Lord Jesus: He loved me and He gave Himself for me, and He also gives me good guidance! Really good guidance!

Scars

Scars are part of life, collected by us all as we go through life. Our first scars are usually on our knees from when we progressed from crawling to toddling to walking to running. Most of these scars have long since faded. There are other scars too – places on our skin where we have had accidents, or an operation or two.

My most prominent scar is on my chest. In 1993 our doctor said that we should watch and see why my EKG was not normal. Then in 1994 he told me we needed to do something about the murmur we could now hear clearly in my heart. So I went to a cardiologist, who recommended replacing my aortic valve, which was no longer sealing, but allowing blood to flow back into my left atrium. So I gulped and asked to be referred to a group of heart surgeons recommended by a member of our church. We set the date for June 9, 1994, a time when there would be the least impact on the life of our church. The day before the operation I had a heart catheterization, and stayed in the hospital for the operation the next day. The people in our church had a 36-hour prayer vigil for me! And I also asked our Via de Cristo community to pray for me. You did, faithfully.

The morning of the operation I was wheeled into the OR, and the last thing I remember is seeing a nurse give me an injection. The next thing I remember was slowly coming to in the hospital's cardiac surgical ICU. I don't remember being on a breathing machine, but Martha said I didn't like it. Late that night in the hospital I became aware of someone on my right hand, so I opened my eyes. There was no one there! A little later I became aware of someone else on my left hand. I opened my eyes again, and there was no one there! Interesting, I thought, and went back to sleep. The next day I was retelling the story of the presences (who seemed to me to be like nurses) and remembered that there was another presence, who appeared to me at the foot of my bed as a white form with a sash and buckle across "his" chest, and who seemed to be satisfied with what was happening. Now when I tell that story, others tell me stories of their own encounter with angels.

I had asked for a tissue valve to replace the aortic valve. I found out that I had been given a "bovine pericardial valve," a valve manufactured from the heart sac of a calf. The jokes started then. My friends and church members teased and said it must have been a "Moo-ving experience," so I should milk it for all it was worth! That I have done.

Now I sport a nine-inch scar on my chest, where my sternum and skin healed after the operation. I am proud of my scar! It's a sign of healing for me. It's a sign of how God and humans can work together to bring about healing and redemption. To me, it's a wonderful, visible sign of God's love and power. I am proud of it! There are other scars, not so easily seen, but just as real. I am proud of them too, because they show God's love reconstructing me!
